Living in the light of the Resurrection

It's hard to believe that Easter 2024 is already here. Lent and Easter this year, it has to be said, could hardly have been earlier, so it's understandable that there might be a sense of haste in everything that has happened so far. And this hurried Lent has had as its background the theme of **Tarrying with God** from different perspectives.



The first week, from Ash Wednesday, used *Waiting in Darkness* to focus our thoughts as we learned about waiting on God through the difficulties of life. *Unity* was the theme of the first full week - looking at how all of us, as God's people, might grow in unity and wholeness.

Week 2 focused on *Movement* while tarrying/waiting on God. We continue to move while we wait, because God is always at work, always moving, and we need to learn what it is to move with God as we journey together.

The Holy Spirit grabbed our attention in week 3, as we explored how the Spirit works - with power, whilst often disrupting our lives and deepening our relationship with Jesus and bringing us together as God's people. The 4th week helped us look at *Quiet*, learning what role this played in the lives of Moses, Elijah, Job, Jonah, and Jeremiah. We particularly looked at how, even when we think God is silent, He is always at work - our eyes are simply not always open to His ways.

Week 5 brought us to explore *Healing*, how it involves mind and body, physical and spiritual. The Christian journey needs healing in all ways: we need the healing power of the Spirit, we need healing of the mind and body, and society as a whole needs to be healed. But to be healed we need to reach out for this grace as Jesus offers himself to us.

The final week brought us to look at *Weeping*, being reminded that at important times Jesus wept, Judas wept, Peter wept, Mary wept and all creation weeps in the face of the realities around us. But these 6 weeks of reading and study bring us not to despair, but to celebration and rejoicing, as we acknowledge Christ's victory over death and sin - a victory we too can experience as we tarry with God throughout our lives.

I pray that this Easter will bring you all such confidence in your faith.
