Living in the Spirit

50 days after Easter we have a special celebration - the festival of Pentecost. Here we give thanks for the gift of God's Spirit to his Church and it is often referred to as the Birthday of the Church.

Pentecost also expresses a very special attribute of the Church - that even though it can be found in many forms, at heart we are all meant to be one: there is a unity bestowed upon all Christians that comes from the Holy Spirit.



In a very polarised world, this is a crucial part of the Pentecost message that we need to hear and very much take to heart. As I look around today, never in my lifetime have people been so divided about so many things and so bitterly - whether it be about political affiliation, the effects of Brexit, human rights and much more. As we celebrate the gift of the Spirit this year, perhaps we need most to remember the diversity of people present when the Spirit was given - more than a dozen ethnic groups are mentioned in the Pentecost story - yet it is the same Spirit who communicates with all of them, regardless, bestowing the same gifts of healing and renewing.

It is through living in the power of the Spirit that we, as followers of Jesus Christ, are able to do the things we do: worshipping together week after week; preaching the gospel through our words and our deeds; keeping our churches going; creating new church communities, and so much more. It is the Spirit who makes the seemingly impossible, possible. As we read in Acts:

"I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy."

Living in the Spirit gives us abilities and qualities we otherwise wouldn't know, helping us see possibilities, inspiring our vision and speaking God's truth to the world in many and varied ways.

May this Pentecost reinvigorate us for God's work in this part of his world. Come, Holy Spirit!
